

Conversation Starters for Parents & Kids

One of the best ways you can boost communication with your kids is to ask questions. Thought-provoking questions can help you discern your child's emotional and spiritual needs. Try these easy conversation starters with your grade-schoolers and teens.

Great questions to ask your grade-schooler:

- 1. What is one activity that makes you feel really excited? (Riding your bike, doing arts and crafts, playing with friends, etc.)
- 2. When you pray, do you also listen to hear what God is telling your heart?
- 3. What would you say is the difference between liking something and loving it? (You like pizza, toys, and movies, but you love your parents, friends, and pets.)
- 4. Do you know how someone gets to heaven?
- 5. Do you know what your conscience is? What does it take to make you smile?
- 6. What are two questions you would really like to ask God?
- 7. Which do you like most being alone or being with other people? If you could improve one thing about yourself, what would it be?

Great questions to ask your teenager:

1. Describe the kind of person you would like to marry one day.

- 3. What are the 2 nicest things anyone has ever said about you?
- 4. If someone asked you how you know your parents love you, what would you say?
- 5. What are some characteristics of being mature? How do you decide who your friends will be?

- 7. What does it mean to have integrity and a good name?
- 8. What qualities are you looking for in a potential spouse?
- 9. What are your top three strengths?
- 10. How do you think being a teenager today is different from when I was a teen?
- 11. How does Christian dating differ from a non-Christian dating?
- 12. How would you define success?
- 13. How will you know when you've found the person you want to marry?
- 14. How can I be praying for you? How are Christian kids at school different from non-Christian kids?
