LEAN IN

Let us read the following passages:

Ecclesiastes 11:1-2

Send your grain across the seas, and in time, profits will flow back to you. But divide your investments among many places, for you do not know what risks might lie ahead.

Matthew 25:19-21

"After a long time, their master returned from his trip and called them to give an account of how they had used his money. The servant to whom he had entrusted the five bags of gold said, 'Sir, you gave me five bags of gold to invest, and I have doubled the amount.' The master was full of praise. 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in handling

this small amount, so now I will give you many more responsibilities. Let's celebrate together!'

Ecclesiastes 11:6

Plant your seed in the morning and keep busy all afternoon, for you don't know if profit will come from one activity or another—or maybe both.

Proverbs 24:27

Do your planning and prepare your fields before building your house.
